2022/2023 Annual Assessment Report

Below are the Student Learning Outcomes which have been measured for the current annual assessment report along with the measured results.

Student Learning Outcome 1 - Students will demonstrate the professional knowledge needed for entry-level practice as a school counselor. This will be demonstrated by a 90% pass rate on the PRAXIS: Professional School Counselor Exam.

Result: 100% of graduating school counselors scored a 580 (required passing score) or above on the Praxis.

Student Learning Outcome 3 - Students will demonstrate professionalism and the appropriate disposition for working as a school counselor.

Result: 89% of school counselor students (8/9) that completed the Oral Competency Exam scored at or above proficiency on all items.

Student Learning Outcome 5 - Students will succeed in obtaining certification and appropriate employment as school counselors. 85% of graduates will be employed as school counselors within 2 years of graduation.

Result: 13 school counselor alumni (ranging from 2020-23) responded to the alumni survey. Of the 13, 11 (85%) reported being employed in school settings. The other 2 reported a church and a nonprofit employment setting.

Additional feedback was gathered on the strengths of the program and areas for improvement. These items will be reviewed by the School Counseling Committee for program improvement.
