MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

I am very proud of the work we have done this academic year with our first—and hopefully last—hybrid school year. Over the past few months, we have experienced a variety of new challenges that our students, staff, faculty, and alumni masterfully overcame with the perseverance and spirit Lee University is known for. We are feeling hopeful and energized as we head into a summer where the global pandemic restrictions are starting to lift, but also mindful of the many ways in which programs, institutions, students, families, and communities are still facing.

Since 2015, Lee University LEAP presents opportunity for students to grow and develop as thinking, believing, talented, and compassionate responsible citizens, so much required in our world today. As we prepare to come back to campus this fall 2021, it is important to look back and remember all the incredible milestones LEAP has achieved these past 12 months. This past year, LEAP hosted several new workshops and activities on-campus, including our inaugural, fully virtual "Lee First-Generation College Celebration Day via Moodle" in November 2020 in collaboration with the TRIO McNair Scholars Program and the Office of First-Year Programs. LEAP also launched several new initiatives for our participants in response to COVID-19, including our "Student Resources Page via Moodle" in August 2020 and "Laptop/iPad Student Check-Out Program" in January 2021 to provide connectivity for those seeking additional technical support in their coursework. In addition, LEAP provided direct emergency aid to several students in August 2020, with over \$22,000 need-based aid sent directly to our participants with high unmet need at Lee.

As we move into the future, I am excited to share the incredible accomplishments and strides LEAP continues to make in preparing our students for academic and career success. From our most recent Year 5 2019-2020 Annual Performance Report (APR) in November 2020, over 94 percent of our LEAP participants persisted from Fall 2019 to Fall 2020, and 99 percent remained in good academic standing. At the end of June 2021, 70 percent of our LEAP participants (N= 111) hold at least a minimum of 3.00+ cumulative GPA, with more than 30 participants holding a 3.90+ GPA at Lee (a program record). Our students not only recognize the importance of academic excellence and servant leadership but also how to adapt to social change and uncertainty in the COVID-19 era.

Looking forward, I am confident that our students will continue to excel and #ExpectSomethingGreat at Lee. With this in mind, I am very thrilled to announce that my colleague Dr. Angela Waltrip ('90), Community Coordinator of LEAP since 2015, has been named by University President Mark L. Walker to serve as the next Director of LEAP, effective July 2021. Dr. Waltrip is no stranger to helping low-income, first-generation students succeed at Lee. For much of her personal and professional life, Dr. Waltrip has equipped, mentored, and coached hundreds of college students since her early days as a Resident Director of Nora Chambers Hall in the 1990s. During the past six years, Dr. Waltrip has coordinated and overseen the LEAP Peer Mentor Program, where she supervised and trained over 120 LEAP peer mentors at Lee. Dr. Waltrip has also served as an Adjunct Faculty in the School of Religion and taught several online courses for the Division of Adult Learning (DAL). In her new role as director of LEAP, Dr. Waltrip is poised to build upon the program's successes and its mission to enhance diversity, equity, and inclusion.





I am also pleased to announce that my colleague Kristin Pope ('12), Academic Coordinator of LEAP, has been appointed the next Director of the Center for Calling and Career (CCC) at Lee, effective July 2021. During the past six years, Kristin has empowered, mentored, and coached hundreds of college students and has overseen the recruitment and selection of both incoming and current LEAP participants. Kristin has also coordinated the dissemination of both federal and institutional scholarships as well as managed and prepared our semester learning communities and tutoring services in partnership with The Hub: Center for Student Success and the Writing Center. I applaud both Dr. Waltrip and Kristin, along with our full-time LEAP Coach Andrew DiPastena ('95, '21) and LEAP SVA Career Advisor & Counselor Kay McDaniel, for their unwavering commitment to student success at Lee.

As we continue to work towards a more inclusive and equitable environment for us all, it remains vital we listen to the issues and concerns of diverse communities. Therefore, I am excited to announce today that I will be transitioning into a new position at Lee in which I will serve as the first Asian American faculty member for the Helen DeVos College of Education (HDCE), starting August 2021. In my new role as Director of Graduate Studies in Education, I will oversee and advise several graduate programs, including the M.Ed., MSHEA, Ed.S., and Ed.D. degrees. If you are interested in furthering your education, I invite you to contact me. All LEAP and McNair students will be given preferential treatment for graduate admissions to Lee.

In closing, Lee University LEAP / TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) and the Office of the Provost and Academic Affairs, along with our fellow campus partners from Academic Support, Student Financial Services, Financial Aid, The Hub, CCC, Center for Teaching Excellence, Leonard Center, Counseling Center, Office of Racial & Ethnic Relations, and Office of Grants & Foundation Relations, have responded to the pandemic with grace, generosity, and commitment; and I remain confident that it will continue to do so in the months and years ahead, drawing from our faith and trust in one another as a Christ-centered liberal arts institution.

Thank you once again for your continuing support of LEAP.

About Us

Funded by the U.S. Department of Education, Lee University LEAP is a TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) program for selected undergraduate students designed to increase students' persistence and completion at Lee (Grant # P042A200997). Our goal is to help students overcome academic, social, and cultural barriers to higher education. LEAP offers individualized success coaching, skill-building workshops, leadership and service opportunities, academic and cultural enrichment activities, peer mentoring, graduate school preparation, company site visits, and an annual scholarship of \$1,000. LEAP is the only TRIO SSS program in the state of Tennessee who is a member of the Council for Christian Colleges & Universities (CCCU).

Vision Statement

Lee University LEAP aspires to be a nationally recognized TRIO SSS model for supporting underrepresented college students, including those who identify as low-income, first-generation, students with disability, and students of color.

Learning Outcomes

As a result of participating in LEAP, students will...

- 1) Maintain or return to good academic standing at Lee.
- 2) Report increased confidence in a defined set of life skills both on-campus and off-campus.
- 3) Use financial aid effectively and efficiently to graduate with a higher debt-free rate than the rate for non-LEAP Pell recipients at Lee.
- 4) Demonstrate preparation to enter the church and nonchurch vocation, professional/graduate school, military, and/ or supporting a family after college.
- 5) Graduate on-time within two to four years of initial enrollment at Lee.

Administrative Outcomes

The Department of Lee University LEAP seeks to...

 Provide a holistic, comprehensive student support services for all TRIO SSS participants (e.g., low-income students, first-generation students, students of color, students with disability, adult students, independent students).

- 3) Engage LEAP students in a variety of events and services that supports their personal, social, spiritual, cultural and physical development and ultimately, lifelong success.

- 5) Foster inclusive excellence that can lead to transformational change for student learning and achievement.







Demographic Characteristics of LEAP Students


Below are a few demographic characteristics reported from the 2020-2021 academic year of LEAP participants at Lee.














STUDENT SUCCESS

Academic Performance of LEAP

LEAP participants are some of the most talented students at Lee who demonstrate outstanding academic achievements, creativity, and servant leadership. During the 2020-2021 academic year, LEAP participants held an average cumulative GPA of 3.46 (+.08 from 19-20) at Lee. Specifically, 7 out of 158 participants earned a 4.00 GPA, 61 out of 158 participants earned a 3.70 GPA and above, 97 out of 158 participants earned a 3.40 GPA and above, and 111 out of 158 participants earned a 3.00 GPA and above during the 2020-2021 academic year at Lee.

The total number of LEAP participants with a 3.00 GPA and above (N= 111) was slightly lower this academic year compared to the previous academic year (N= 116 students). Only 1 student out of 158 participant is on academic probation, and a total of 6 out of 158 participants have a cumulative 2.50 GPA or below.

LEAP Coaching, Mentoring, and Programming Initiatives

During the 2020-2021 academic year, LEAP students engaged in 1,172 Coaching Meetings (in-person, Zoom, phone), 1,567 Peer Mentoring Sessions, and 264 Tutoring Sessions at Lee. The total hours of tutoring and supplemental instruction combined (LEAP, Writing Center, The Hub) had increased by 149 this year; however, the number of LEAP coaching sessions had decreased by 236 from the 2019-2020 academic year (N = 1,408) due to the discontinuation of the High Touch Team (HTT) initiative last Summer 2020. The total number of coaching sessions completed by our LEAP coaches are as follow: Andrew DiPastena (N = 440), Kristin Pope (N = 270), Dr. Angela Waltrip (N = 260), and Dr. Roy Y. Chan (N = 202).

LEAP hosted a total of 26 Campus Workshops, 2 Gateway Social Outings, 2 Service Projects, 1 First-Generation Day, and 1 Cultural Excursion. As Lee transitioned to mostly in-person instruction, several LEAP events were held face-to-face in the classroom with PPE's provided for all workshops/events. A few of notable activities included the "LEAP Especially for Sophomores Dinner" in September 2020, "LEAP First-Generation College Celebration Day via Moodle" in November 2020, "LEAP Graduate School Awareness Dinner" in March 2021, "LEAP Conversations with the Provost & Vice President Dr. Debbie Murray" in March 2021, "LEAP GRE Prep Workshop" in April 2021, and "LEAP Awards and Graduation Reception with President Mark L. Walker" in April 2021. Our 2 LEAP freshmen gateway activities were "The Ocoee River Maze" in October 2020 and the "Cleveland Skate Place" in April 2021. Our 2 LEAP service projects included "Memory Care Blankets for Patients with Dementia and Alzheimer's Disease" in October 2020 and "Easter Baskets for Assisted Living and Memory Care Communities" in March 2021. Our rescheduled LEAP cultural excursion trip to Rock City, Georgia occurred in March 2021. With several peer mentors graduating this summer, LEAP hosted a special celebratory event at "Dollywood Amusement Park" in April 2021 to recognize our outstanding student leaders in Pigeon Forge, TN. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 restrictions, the highly anticipated "LEAP Night to Shine with Tim Tebow Foundation" in February 2021 was canceled.







In summary, LEAP hosted and organized a larger number of events and workshops this academic year compared to the previous academic year (due to the COVID-19 lockdown). The average attendance for our on-campus workshops was 19 participants. The LEAP office employed a total of 4 full-time staff members, 16 part-time student peer mentors, 2 part-time office student assistants (Laurel A. Desmarais, Jada C. Williamson), and 2 part-time tutors (Samuel D. Gruber, Ryan Gambill).

Our LEAP participants have won several prestigious awards, scholarships, and honors throughout the 2020-2021 academic year at Lee. Specifically, our federal TRIO SSS program had 16 Ronald E. McNair Scholars, 7 Lettie Pate Whitehead Scholars, 4 iMASS Scholars, 3 Kairos Scholars, 2 Chatlos Scholars, 2 Dr. Scholl Scholars, 2 Poiema Scholars, 1 B.L. Marketing and Communication

Under the direction of Dr. Roy Y. Chan, LEAP has strengthened its marketing and communication strategy across the university. During the 2020-2021 academic year, LEAP sent 32 weekly e-newsletters to all LEAP participants, campus leaders, and supporting faculty members every Monday at 5:00PM EST. LEAP has also engaged in several social media platforms via Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter, receiving well over 100+ new Likes on our Facebook page and 50+ new followers on our Instagram account. With the on-going COVID-19 restrictions, LEAP employed several communication tools (Zoom, Ellucian CRM Advise, StudentLingo) and leveraged our learning management system (Moodle), and marketing automation (TimeTap, Mailchimp, StudentAccess) to communicate with our LEAP participants during the 2020-2021 academic year.

Year 5 Annual Performance Report (APR)

In November 2020, Dr. Roy Y. Chan prepared and submitted our Year 5 2019-2020 Annual Performance Report (APR) to the U.S. Department of Education. LEAP reported a 94% persistence rate and 99% remained in good academic standing. Similar to Year 4 APR results, LEAP met or exceeded grant objectives. Specifically, LEAP reported 132 out of 140 participants persisted from Fall 2019 to Fall 2020, and 138 out of 140 participants received a 2.00 GPA or higher during the 2019-2020 academic year at Lee.

Dr. Waltrip replaces highly respected scholar-practitioner Dr. Roy Y. Chan, who has transitioned into a tenure-track faculty position in the Helen DeVos College of Education at Lee. Dr. Waltrip holds a D.Min. from the Pentecostal Theological Seminary, a M.A. in Mental Health Counseling, a M.Div. in Theological Studies, and a B.A. in Sociology from Lee College.
